

A Conservative government will increase the NHS budget every year. We will cut the deficit, not the NHS. We'll stop Labour's jobs tax, which will take money out of the NHS.

Targets and bureaucracy are distorting the decisions made by doctors and nurses. So we will scrap targets and cut the cost of NHS bureaucracy by a third, getting the money to the frontline.

How a Conservative Government will back the NHS

benefits anymore,' and we'll impose that sanction for up to three years. And those who refuse to accept reasonable job offers could forfeit their benefits for up to three years.

#### What about families?

Families are the building blocks of the Big Society we want to build. That's why we have set ourselves a hugely ambitious aim: to make Britain the most familyfriendly country in Europe. So we will recognise marriage in the tax system, and end the couple penalty in the tax credits system. And we'll also expand the number of health visitors and give every parent with a child under the age of eighteen the right to request flexible working.

We all rely on public services, yet school standards are slipping and Britain's cancer survival rates still lag behind other countries. What will you change?

The most important thing we can do is free our teachers and doctors from all those



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targets and paperwork and let them get on with the job they were trained to do. But there are other things too. We should have good discipline and high standards in all schools, by giving heads and teachers the powers they need. And by stopping Labour's jobs tax we'll save the NHS money, meaning people can get the cancer drugs they're currently denied.

#### What's your view on immigration?

It's too high – and I've always said that if it's not controlled, it can put real pressure on public services in some communities. That's why we'll put a cap on the number of immigrants, bringing net immigration down to the tens of thousands a year rather than running in the hundreds of thousands of recent years.

#### Labour say you'll cut winter fuel payments and pension credit, and end free bus travel and TV licences for over-75s. Will you?

No. All of these benefits will all stay. You have my promise. What's more, we'll increase the value of the basic state pension for all pensioners by linking it to earnings. Unlike Labour, we'll never impose a death tax. And we'll get our police out on the streets instead of filling in paperwork. I want us to be the ones that protect older people from fear.

### What's the biggest challenge facing the economy?
