>>Cindy in Action I Campaigning to Save our Bus Services



Tory cuts to bus services of £120,000 meant that our area has lost the Number 23 bus route – a service vital for Okus Road residents.

The personal impact on residents that relied on the service for work and school – and for getting to other services such as the Health Centre – indicates the lack of proper consultation and concern for the people that depend on this service.

Cindy led our campaign and gathered a huge petition. 1,500 people supported our campaign showing that residents understand the importance of good, local transport services. However the Tories ignored the voice of the people and cut the service.

<< Coate Campaign | The Battle Continues

Tory councillors have failed to listen to the people over development at Coate, or the proposed new school at Croft, or over cuts to local services, including the Home Care Service and our local bus services.

- The views of over 50,000 people in Swindon who oppose development at Coate should be heard.
- The Coate development is likely to cause more gridlocked traffic up and down Marlborough Road.
- It is vital that we protect Swindon from further encroachment onto our green spaces.

We believe that it is time that those who said "No University: No Development" stand by that promise and protect Coate, one of the jewels in Swindon's crown, from being harmed by development.

<< Tories Broken Promises and Big Cuts Society

Broken Promise 1 - Bankers Bonuses

Before the election the Tories said they would limit state owned bank employees to a bonus of £2,000. But now the bankers are set to receive bonuses totalling in excess of £7 billion and the Tory led government do nothing about it.

Broken Promise 2 VAT Increase

David Cameron said before the election that he had "no plans" to increase VAT. Yet that's what he's done at a time when unemployment is rising, inflation is rising, and wages and benefits are being frozen.

Broken Promise 3 - A Better Deal for Swindon

Under Labour Swindon got above inflation increases in it's funding for thirteen consecutive years. We now have two Tory MPs and what's happened? Swindon is having a cut of 8.9% in it's funding this year.

Broken Promise 4 - Sure Start

The Tories said that there was no threat to Swindon's Sure Start schemes. Now we find they are to make a 20% cut in the funding. Cut backs in the service they provide will have an adverse affect on families already being hit by child benefit and wage freezes.

- Roll out free Swindon Capits to all 11-16 year olds

- Increase housing stock with at least 100 new council houses built each year.
- Introduce 20 mph zones in all communities that want them.
